Initial fruit tree pruning is important to help young trees produce thick stems and open canopies where light and air can enter and promote flowering, as well as reduce fungal and bacterial diseases. The best time for pruning fruit trees is at planting and in subsequent years, in early spring before buds break and trees are still dormant.

Pruning & Training - The California Backyard Orchard

Training and pruning newly-planted deciduous fruit trees is one of the most important steps in developing trees with a strong framework (scaffold branches). Trees with a good framework of branches can support heavy crops without limb breakage and will help to bring the young tree into production at an early age.

Training and Pruning Newly Planted Deciduous Fruit Trees ...

Proper training through correct pruning is important for a healthy, strong fruit tree. If a tree is properly trained from a young plant, it needs only moderate annual pruning when it reaches bearing age. Young trees that are neglected will require removal of large branches later. This opens the tree to infectious disease organisms.

Training and pruning fruit trees is important to being a successful fruit grower. You train early in a fruit tree's life to achieve proper/desired shape and form (central leader, open center). The first-early years of a tree's life are most important for proper tree training until the tree reaches its mature height.

Mature female, *Actinidia deliciosa*, (the kiwi in stores) can produce up to 300 pounds of fruit each year. They can grow as much as 15-20 feet of vine from a single bud in a year. Therefore they require attention, training, and year-round pruning to keep them from growing over your home or in my case the deck.
